## Responsibilities for analyst, risk management

- Facilitate operational risk assessments
- Track and report issues and action plans resulting from RCSAs, Internal Audits, Risk Events, until effective closure
- Responsible for maintaining a safe workplace and ensuring that safety is the highest priority
- Develops and implements a Risk and Opportunity Management Plan that defines how risks and opportunities are managed, in accordance with priorities and processes defined by the National Science Foundation
- Design and maintains a Risk and Opportunity Register for tracking risk/opportunity handling plans to completion
- Coordinates the efforts of program stakeholders to identify, quantify, handle, and monitor/report risks and opportunities
- Identifies potential loss areas and their impacts on cost, schedule, or technical performance
- Maintains timely and accurate communication with all stakeholders
- Prioritizes and informs decisions on types and levels of contingency, potential de-scoping activities, and alternate strategies to mitigate the cost or schedule impact of possible threats, or increase the impacts of potential benefits
- Continually determines the program's risk exposure and recommended contingency levels using distributions from probability simulations
