



Example of Anesthetist Job Description

Responsibilities for anesthetist

- Submits meeting agenda items for CRNA group to the Administrative Chief CRNA and will meet at least once per month for their site or location, encourages monthly participation of CRNAs in departmental meetings to include Grand Rounds, and other as indicated by Chairman
- Participates in training and use of scheduling software to provide an up to date live schedule for CRNA staff that will provide real time scheduling information that is both fair and accurate
- Provides clinical guidance to medical students and SRNAs in order to contribute to their clinical training
- Serves on appropriate institutional committees inside of their select location of purview and inside of the Department of Anesthesiology and Pain Service
- Assists with daily work flow operations by coordinating assignments and staff to assure perioperative services metric measures for performance or enhanced by facilitation of first case starts, safe and rapid turnovers, end of schedule daily collapse that promotes cost effective use of CRNA staff
- Assistant Chief CRNA will participate in clinical duties as assigned by MDA Board Coordinator
- Selecting, applying, and inserting appropriate non-invasive and invasive monitoring modalities for

- Documents anesthetic technique, medications used, vital signs and any other significant occurrences during the anesthetic

Qualifications for anesthetist

- Current Florida Advanced Practice Registered Nurse
- Proficient in general anesthesia, regional anesthesia and I.V
- Graduate of an approved school of anesthesia for nurses
- Certified by an appropriate credentialing process
- Must be a graduate of a Nurse Anesthesia Program accredited by the Council of Nurse Anesthesia (COA) or its predecessor
- Must be able to apply good decision making in anesthetic patient care, demonstrate ethical norms of practice, and respect and maintain patient's rights
