Responsibilities for automotive painter

- Determines the methods, techniques, devices and materials that are best suited for the surface finish
- Performs all prep and paint procedures and operations to ensure top quality refinish
- Capable of refinishing to a level consistent to OEM finish without rework (no buffing, no runs, no dirt)
- Capable of disassembly and reassembly procedures
- Spraying approximately 6 (Fully Prepped) RO's per day (2 Fasiyas, 1 - six panel jobs, 3 - Two to three panel jobs) in a spot box
- Will be prepping projects for paint by removing grease, dirt, paint, or rust from surfaces
- Remove accessories, such as chrome or mirrors, from vehicles and mask other surfaces with tape or paper to protect them from paint
- Able to paint X-Small to Small-sized parts, possibly even smaller jobs such as satellites
- Select/operate the correct spray gun for the material being applied, and correct paint
- Apply the industrial automotive paint finished on various types of materials

Qualifications for automotive painter

- Prep and paint vehicles to meet and exceed quality standards
- Approach repair planning with a sense of urgency and detail consistently

- 3 years' experience in directly relevant work preferred
- In lieu of formal course work, a combination of college credits, ASE Certifications, on-the-job training, other formalized training, or experience may be considered
- Ability to possess and maintain a KBRwyle/ASLAC operators permit to move military equipment in/around the Paint booth and adjoining facilities
