Responsibilities for certified occupational therapy assistant

- Demonstrate skills in patient/client treatment and professional consultations to achieve maximum patient/client independence in accordance with individual's functional level and potential
- Have graduated from a two-year college level program approved by the American Occupational Therapy Association, as indicated by school transcript or diploma, or
- Assists in the update of therapeutic plans of care and treatment based on patient needs throughout patient's treatment/stay under the direct supervision of a licensed Occupational Therapist
- Assists in the implementation of therapeutic plans of care and treatment based on patient needs throughout patient's treatment/stay under the direct supervision of a licensed Occupational Therapist
- Assists in the completion of required documentation, in an accurate and thorough manner, of Occupational Therapy treatment in accordance with FHS documentation standard under the supervision of a licensed Occupational Therapist
- Provide initial patient evaluation, in accordance to physician request, in order to initiate appropriate treatment
- Communicate with patients, physicians, nurses and other personnel regarding patient care

- Provide therapist suggestion for treatment when appropriate
- Meets the requirements for certification as an Occupational Therapy
 Assistant established by the American Occupational Therapy Association

Qualifications for certified occupational therapy assistant

- Licensure as a Occupational Therapist Assistant in Pennsylvania or eligibility for licensure
- Requires critical thinking skills, decisive judgment and the ability to work under supervision
- Current licensure as Occupational Therapy Assistant in practicing state and/or nationally certified
- Ability to relate professionally and positively and work cooperatively with residents, families and other employees at all levels
- Possess computer skills of the types and at a level necessary to accomplish the job
- Perform patient visits
