Responsibilities for clinical pharmacy specialist

- Have duties that include reviewing pharmacy and medical claims
- Educate and consult with physicians, pharmacists, nurses, and other members of the health care team, both internally and externally, which will be required
- Provide innovative and applicable ideas in clinical program development, provider education, MTM and/or improvements in programs and edits that already exist, including both improving operational efficiencies, developing new clinical edits
- Plans, implements, performs and measures the clinical processes that will improve treatment outcomes while minimizing adverse drug events and contribute favorable quality and financial outcomes
- Provide drug therapy management and consultative services which will include a review of participant's drug profiles
- Work with prescribers to optimize drug regimen, monitoring quality of pharmacy practice, and provide inservice education to Interdisciplinary Teams
- Serve as ElderPlace's liaison to the dispensing pharmacy
- Focus on optimizing drug therapy outcomes, improving drug utilization, improving patient compliance, preventing adverse drug events, and acting as a drug therapy resource to physicians and other members of the healthcare team

- Education (Transcripts Required)
- Utilizes risk reduction and improvement strategies such as REMS, FMEA, Learning from Defects, PCDA to evaluate and improve medication use processes
- Previous experience/training, in an accredited PGY-1 residency or equivalent years of hospital pharmacy practice
- Pharmacy practice residency or equivalent experience preferred
- Certification in anticoagulation training or equivalent preferred
- Excellent knowledge of medical terminology, coordination of benefits, complaints and grievance guidelines and prescription drug utilization management requirements
