Responsibilities for ECHO technologist

- Properly identify and orient patient to equipment, function and exam
- Maintain adequate records of all exams
- Complete required recordkeeping in a timely manner including IAC records
- Ensures efficient and consistent department operations
- Takes clinical direction from lead echo tech and medical director
- Maintain equipment, exam room and work area to ensure patient and staff safety
- Participate in the Quality Improvement Program for the department
- Administer one dimensional, two dimensional, and Doppler (pulse wave, imaging and non-imaging continuous wave and color flow mapping) echocardiograms to patients
- Explain test procedures, attach equipment to patients, adjust control settings to obtain the optimum display, and record on videotape and chart recorder
- Complete reports of echocardiogram examinations, including complete measurements and initial interpretation of results

Qualifications for ECHO technologist

- Work requires the level of knowledge normally acquired through the completion of A.R.D.M.S / R.D.C.S
- Registered Diagnostic Cardiac Sonographer (RDSC), Registered Cardiac Sonographer (RCS), or registry eligible according to the ARDMS or CCI standards
- Ability to grasp firmly with both hands and lift up to twenty (20) pounds

- Standing, walking, sitting, carrying, pushing, pulling, climbing, balancing, bending, stooping, squatting, crouching, twisting, reaching, handling, kneeling, and wrist and digital dexterity
- Patient lifting, ambulating, and transfer of patients in wheelchairs, on gurneys and beds, and for use of mechanical lifts
- Speaking, hearing, and visual acuity to perform tests on patients and receive and interpret instructions
