Responsibilities for graduate nurse

- Current Georgia RN license (may apply without license, but must have license prior to licensure deadline)
- Admits patients to NIC holding unit, performing assessments and completing required documentation per policy
- Follows established procedures for performing non-invasive cardiac diagnostic testing and cardio versions
- Notifies proceduralist of findings that warrant attention prior to the procedures
- Coordinates and contributes to exceptional safe, quality patient care through accurate and timely patient assessments, re-assessments, development of an appropriate plan of care, evaluation of the effectiveness of care and modifies plan of care accordingly as measured by quality audits, observations and core measures
- Contributes to safe, quality care through accurate and timely processing physician's orders, performing treatments, administering medication, interpreting/analyzing clinical data, and administering emergency procedures as measured by quality audits, core measures, preventable sentinel/serious events
- Contributes to exceptional quality and safe patient care by demonstrating competency in clinical nursing skills, procedures/treatments, and critical decision making and maintaining a high level of expertise in professional nursing as measured by quality audits, core measures and preventable sentinel /serious events
- Contributes to exceptional patient satisfaction by establishing a

- open communication and providing emotional, psychological support to patients, friends and families as measured by patient satisfaction
- Ensures exceptional physician and employee commitment through collaboration, effective communication and timely and accurate documentation as measured by physician and employee satisfaction and documentation audits
 - Contributes to the achievement of exceptional health care by functioning as a member of the team as measured by active participation in department initiatives, unit meetings, committees and special projects

Qualifications for graduate nurse

- RN License in the State of Missouri or must obtain within 90 days of your graduation date
- Must have a current Basic Life Support (CPR) certification through the American Heart Association
- Graduate of an accredited school in Nursing or Nursing Diploma program
- Bachelors of Science or greater in Nursing, preferred
- Proof of current CPR and Hepatitis profile
- If permitted by state regulations, the New Graduate RN may be employed by the Home Health Agency when approved by the Regional Clinical and Operational Leadership
