Responsibilities for hazardous

- Weekly report on all work associated with HW and HM (SRE Deliverable 1)
- Performs regular safety inspections and surveillances, and formal environmental and safety audits to ensure contract requirements are met or exceeded
- Evaluates violations or problems discovered during inspections to provide advice to management on implementing changes to be compliant with corporate and government EHS policies
- Reviews the site-specific EHS plans and procedures to establish validity and any need for amendment
- Investigates spills and accidents and prepares reports for submission to the customer
- Investigates personal incidents and aircraft/vehicle accidents to determine root cause and any corrective actions to prevent a repeat occurrence
