Responsibilities for industrial painter

- Apply primers or sealers to prepare new surfaces, such as bare wood or metal, for finish coats
- Calculate amounts of required materials and estimate costs, based on surface measurements or work orders
- Review paint specifications on new job releases, evaluate and requisition supplies as needed
- Assist with the selection and evaluation of suppliers for overall quality objectives and costs
- Prepare parts for application of primers and paints
- Use plugs or other means to mask tapped holes on tables, mass bars and other parts
- Allocate painted items to job specific areas or to the crib and provide job status information through verbal or written means to production coordinator
- Monitor and maintain paint, job and section master paint lists
- Some disassembly and assembly of mechanical components
- Read specifications, blueprints, diagrams and schematic drawings to determine work procedures

Qualifications for industrial painter

- Ability and willingness to wear personal protective equipment, for example safety glasses, gloves, ear plugs, safety shoes, and respirator
- Minimum of 6 months of industrial painting experience

- Employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds
- Be able to titrate and adjust chemical level of seven-stage spray wash
