Responsibilities for interventional radiology

- Participate in all daily duties necessary to perform high quality patient care and imaging within the Cath/IR Department
- Obtain optimal radiographs
- Assist the physician in an aseptic environment
- Be capable of patient monitoring
- Assist radiologists with exams and procedures
- Work with cross-functional teams to deliver the highest quality care and service to our patients and physicians
- Assessing and reassessing the patient's condition and accordingly sets the plan of care including evaluating the patient's adaptation to the care treatment, responsiveness to care and readiness for discharge
- Prepare film for file room and/or hang film on viewers for timely review by the Radiologist
- Maintain supplies in examination rooms and monitor equipment operations and maintenance
