Responsibilities for interventional radiology

- Ensure images are submitted to Heart Lab or PACs systems for physician's review and reporting in order to provide documentation of procedures and timely reports
- Stock and prepare the Lab suites, for each procedure, in order to ensure that all necessary supplies and equipment are readily available and in optimal working condition
- Using the nursing process to effectively plan and manage patient care, our nurses deliver individualized nursing care to patients in compliance with established hospital guidelines, nursing care standards and policies and in accordance with external regulatory agencies such as the Association for Radiologic Nurses and Diagnostic Imaging (ARIN)
- Establishes quality improvement, fiscal productivity and patient satisfaction goals and objects in conjunction with upper management
- Extracts pertinent information from performance assessment and improvement studies, initiates corrective action plans, and re-monitors results
- Monitors and assists with the collection, documentation and reporting of performance assessment and improvement data
- Monitors and evaluates the activities of the employees in the angiography department and provides management coaching, guidance, and on-the-job training and retraining, as necessary, to ensure operational efficiency and adherence to policies and procedures, time lines and regulatory requirements
- Conducts yearly competency reviews for all interventional technologists

- Acts as a resource and provides technical direction in complex cases

Qualifications for interventional radiology

- Must have at least 9 months experience in a patient, child, or health care setting or environment OR currently enrolled in a Healthcare Program
- Must be able to speak, read and write
- Must be able to demonstrate a basic knowledge of patient care and processes in a Radiology setting
- Must complete a Body Mechanics Class for preventative back injury and proper lifting techniques upon initial orientation
- Must be able to demonstrate working knowledge of a computer
- Must be able to demonstrate patient centered/patient valued behaviors by communicating effectively with patients, families, nurses, physicians, and other hospital personnel
