Responsibilities for interventional radiology

- Relates the preparation information to patients or nursing as required
- Performs venous access procedures according to departmental policy
- Performs contrast media administration according to hospital and departmental policies
- Prior to the start of any procedure, carefully explains the procedures to the patient, parent, or legal guardian, using easily understood terms and obtains verbal permission from the patient to perform the exam
- Uses translator as required
- Ensures that the physician is aware of possible pregnancy and obtains a written consent from the patient and/or her physician for any exam performed during pregnancy
- Utilizes appropriate skills in accurately and descriptively documenting
 patient's pertinent clinical information including the patient's needs, taking
 into consideration the growth and development level of the patient and age
 specific related factors as evidenced by documentation on the history form
- Responsibly documents patient allergies and pertinent medical surgical history
- Obtains all pertinent lab results as required
- Consults with radiologist regarding contraindications to ordered exam
