- Represent company with Federal, State and Local environmental regulatory agencies during rule-making procedures and compliance negotiations including resolution of notices of violation or administrative enforcement orders
- Manage vendor performance, contracts, resources and budgets

- Lead regular meetings to communicate plans with Supply Planning team in San Francisco and Dublin
