Responsibilities for mechanical superintendent

- Responsible for the rectification of Hawk T.65/a & T.165 aircraft assigned to the Mechanical Trade Superintendent by the Aircraft Rectification Team Leader ensuring that sufficient aircraft are available to deliver the organisation's commitments across trade boundaries
- Leads a team of approximately 35 Tradesmen/Supervisors
- Ensures that appropriate numbers of staff are available, suitably qualified and experienced to complete the required work
- Ensures work is carried out in accordance with the standards and procedures detailed within the MOE
- Certifies maintenance and carries out independent inspections
