



Example of Nurse Anesthetist Job Description

Responsibilities for nurse anesthetist

- Maintains current licensure requirements for CRNA practice
- Peri-Anesthesia Care
- Post-Operative Care
- Perform and document a pre-anesthetic assessment and evaluation of the patient
- Develop and implement an anesthetic plan of care, including monitoring modalities and post-anesthesia follow-up evaluation and care
- Select, obtain and administer the anesthetic plan of care, including induction, maintenance and emergence phase anesthesia
- Recognize alterations in physiologic responses to the surgical procedure and/or the anesthetic, takes appropriate action and notifies the responsible physician as indicated
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- Demonstrate the knowledge and skills necessary to provide the care appropriate to the age of the patient served
- Recognize alterations in physiologic responses to the surgical procedure and/or the anesthetic, take appropriate action and notify the responsible physician as indicated

Qualifications for nurse anesthetist

- Must have a strong understanding of pre-anesthesia medications and post-anesthesia medications
- Must be a graduate of an accredited school of nursing and an accredited school of nurse anesthesia• New graduates are encouraged to apply
- 2-3 years of experience as a CRNA preferred but new graduates will be considered
- Certification as a Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) from the National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists and the Texas Board of Nursing
- Prefer 1 year experience as a CRNA
- Graduate of an approved school of nursing with a current license to practice in New York State
