



# Example of Nurse Tech Job Description

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Our company is growing rapidly and is searching for experienced candidates for the position of nurse tech. ## Responsibilities for nurse tech

- Assist patient with activities of daily living to include eating and drinking, bathing, shaving, oral care, grooming, and elimination
- Engages in evidence-based best practices that enhance the patient experience, including SAFETY rounding, communication fundamentals/AIDET, Teach-Back, Narrating Care
- Participates as an active member of the healthcare team and positively promotes the rest of the team to patients/families/caregivers and other colleagues
- Assist with patient safety issues such as presence of identification arm band, adherence to patient fall protocol and use of restraints, positioning of patient, promotion of an environment for rest and sleep, reporting of incidents/injury occurrences
- Help the patient with daily activities
- Promptly answering call lights
- Reporting any issues or progress observed
- Must Have Current AHA BLS
- Must be Currently Enrolled in and Attending an Accredited Nursing Program and Have Completed at Least 1 Semester (Must Include Anatomy and Physiology)
- Observes and reports changes in patient condition to the RN

## Qualifications for nurse tech

- Is a graduate of a professional school of nursing who has taken but not successfully completed the State board of Nursing examination within the first year following graduation
- Maintains enrollment in a professional school of nursing
- A nursing student enrolled in a professional school of nursing program with successful course completion of Medical/Surgical Nursing and Fundamentals of Nursing & Skills, and maintains enrollment
- A graduate of a professional school of nursing who has taken but not successfully completed the State board of Nursing examination within the first year following graduation
- Must be currently enrolled in an accredited RN program
- American Heart Association (AHA) BLS certification is required
