Responsibilities for occupational health nurse

- Maintains professional development in an effort to stay abreast of health and related issues
- Compiles and enters data in the Health Management electronic documentation system
- Provide case management for occupational injuries, and integrated disability management as the liaison between associates, department managers, health care providers and insurers to minimize worker's compensation/disability costs and lost-time work
- Minimize absenteeism and health care costs by on-site provision of professional care for minor illnesses and injuries
- Manages Physical Capacity Profile assessments
- Prevents injuries and illnesses by analyzing historical records
- Plant operations are 24 hours a day for most of the year
- Observes all safety, environmental and quality system standard
- Performs other duties as assigned by Team Leader and required to support the needs of the business
- Provides occupational health and travel medicine consultations, evaluations and immunizations to international travelers, expatriate employees and dependents according to Clinical Nursing Directives

Qualifications for occupational health nurse

- 2 or more years of acute or occupational nursing experience is recommended
- Licensed Practical Nurse with current, active, and unrestricted state license
