## Responsibilities for occupational therapist

- Adhere to policies and practices of applicable professional organizations, facility and Company

- Results of patient assessments are used as baseline measurements to determine the kind of care required to meet a patient's initial needs, his/her needs as they change in response to care

- Successful completion of an occupational therapy program at a school of occupational therapy approved by the American Occupational Therapy Association or the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of American Medical Association or the committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation of the American Medical Association
- Graduate of an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy
- Graduation from an accredited school of occupational therapy required
