## Responsibilities for occupational therapy

- Modifies treatment approaches to reflect the needs of the patient under the supervision of an OT
- Implements and updates therapeutic plan of care and treatment based on patient needs throughout patient's treatment/stay
- Completes all required documentation, in an accurate and thorough manner, of Occupational Therapy treatment in accordance with FHS documentation standard
- Implements direct therapy for children with a variety of deficits in fine motor skills, visual perceptual motor skills, sensory processing and self-help skills, upper extremity strength, range of motion, muscle tone, dynamic sitting/standing balance for functional task and trunk stability, using evidence-based techniques
- Collaborates and communicates with families, other therapists, nurses, social workers, director, developmental staff, and contractors to provide the best quality of care and optimal outcomes for each child
- Assists in providing evaluation, intervention and documentation for children between the ages of 3 and 22 years who have been identified as having special needs who may be physically disabled using the integrated model of service duties in the Least Restrictive Environment (L.R.E.)
- Assists in provides direct treatment, monitoring and consultation to the educational team to help students acquire educationally related functional activities

- Willing to assist with extra assignments based on caseload
- Follows the departmental procedures, attends in-services and departmental meeting and completes documentation requirements for the District

## Qualifications for occupational therapy

- NBCOT certification
- Bachelor or Master of Science Degree in Occupational Therapy and an earned doctorate in a related field
- Previous teaching experience in a baccalaureate or higher degree program is preferred
- Must be able to effectively provide quality services to impaired individuals and be tolerant of individual lifestyles
- Current licensure with Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies to practice Occupational Therapy Assistant required
- Clinical degree in Occupational Therapy with a minimum of a Bachelor's in Occupational Therapy and evidence of completion of coursework towards a post-professional degree in Occupational Therapy or a related field OR evidence of significant post-degree continuing education in a specialty area
