Responsibilities for occupational therapy

- Communicate with team members and outside agencies to identify patient needs and overall condition of the patient
- Document all aspects of care and outcome in a manner that is clear to others and meets service standards
- Delegate appropriate patient activities to co-workers, O.T
- Exhibit clinical skills relevant to level of education and training in respective specialty
- Provide patient and family education in a variety of physical settings
- Perform appropriate occupational therapy evaluations, implement and manage an individualized evidence-based patient plan of care according to physician orders
- Openly communicate with case management to assist with throughput
- Assess patients' need and use devices such as walkers, shower chairs, bedside commodes, splints, ADL equipment
- Implement an established treatment plan using appropriate modalities
- Monitor patient's response to treatment plan

Qualifications for occupational therapy

- Graduation from an Occupational Therapy program or completion of an Occupational Therapy Assistant Certificate program approved by the American Occupational Therapy Association required

- Bachelor or Master of Science Degree in Occupational Therapy and an earned doctorate in a related field, or willingness to pursue a doctoral degree upon hire
- At least entry-level professional competency of Occupational Therapy practice, theory, principles and applications as defined in competencies departmental policy
- Associate Degree in Occupational Therapy
