Responsibilities for occupational

- Communicate patient's progress or concerns both verbally and in writing with physician, patient, family, other hospital personnel and community agencies
- Oversee all treatment provided by O.T
- Continuously improve patient care delivery and enhances your own professional development
- Increase awareness of health and safety issues by providing community and hospital staff education
- Develops and maintains effective communication with peers and leadership within the dept, health care team members within CHP and outside referring physicians and school personnel
- Establishes a plan of care with long-term and short-term goals to remediate the impairments and functional limitations identified during the evaluation process
- Integrate family centered care through the education of caregivers in appropriate activities for carryover of goals and intervention in the home and community settings
- Maintains written/electronic documentation for all clinical services rendered including documentation of the initial assessment, re-assessment, cancellations, follow-up visits, and discharge summary which meets or exceeds the standard established for the facility by the organization
- Participate in and is supportive of departmental projects (lectures to Hospital staff, community education, research, and strategic plan)
- Performs occupational therapy assessment and re-assessment using objective tests and measures or standardized assessments to identify the child's

Qualifications for occupational

- Two (2) years of appropriate experience as an occupational therapist, and has achieved a satisfactory grade on a proficiency examination conducted, approved, or sponsored by the U.S. Public Health Service, except that such determinations of proficiency do not apply with respect to persons initially licensed by a State or seeking initial qualification as an occupational therapist after December 31, 1977 required
- One (1) year of Occupational Therapy experience to practice without supervision or less than one (1) year if practicing under supervision, , ALF/PCH, required
- At least 2 years of experience necessary to treat infants (0-15 months) independently as determined by meeting departmental clinical competencies established for occupational therapy
- Home Care or Long Term Care exp preferred
- Current National Board Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) certification as an OTR
- CO Occupational Therapist (OT) License
