Responsibilities for outpatient therapist

- Document all aspects of care and outcome in a manner that is clear to others and meets service standards
- Restoring patient's function, alleviating pain, and preventing disabilities by planning and administering medically prescribed physical therapy
- Meeting the patient's goals and needs and provides quality care by assessing and interpreting evaluations and test results
- Determining physical therapy treatment plans in consultation with Physicians or by prescription
- Helping patient accomplish treatment plan and accept therapeutic devices by administering manual exercises
- Documenting patient care services by charting in patient and department records
- Reviews available medical records and obtains pertinent medical history from patient or family
- Ensures that patient has given informed consent to treatment
- Evaluates each patient using age and diagnosis appropriate assessment tests and measurements, including appropriate outcome assessment tool(s)
- Integrates assessment results to identify functional problems and prioritizes care needs with patient and family

Qualifications for outpatient therapist

- Masters degree in Speech Pathology from a university program accredited by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association
- Holds or is working towards a Certificate of Clinical Competence of the American-Speech-Hearing Association
- American Heart Association Basic Life Support (AHA-BLS) for Healthcare Provider certification -or
- Pelvic Health and Lymphedema experience, preferred
- Must be currently licensed as a Physical Therapist in New York State, OR must have a valid permit and become licensed and registered within one (1) year of employment
