- Completing paperwork within appropriate time frames and ensuring best therapeutic practices
- Maintains standards for treatment procedures and professional ethics established by the TOTA and AOTA and TBOTE
- Takes initiative to train techs in various physical therapy techniques, volunteer program, student programs
- Re-comment and/or design special adaptive equipment for the person served to improve function in their home, community and/or work environments
- Participate in Quality Assessment and Improvement activities as assigned
- Accept and respond to referrals, make referrals to appropriate resources and educate potential referral sources about the scope of services and the process of initiating services
- Perform complete evaluations & re-assessments in a timely fashion to obtain data necessary for patients of various diagnoses on assigned program
- Establish an Intervention Plan and Goals that are clear, measurable, behavioral, functional, contextually relevant and appropriate to the client's needs, desires and expected outcomes
- Perform discharge planning to facilitate smooth transition to next level of care
- Complete all required documentation according to program standards, reflecting patient-centered care by relating interventions to established goals & justifying skilled need
