- Permanent TX Physical Therapist (PT) license
- Current licensure as a Physical Therapist in the state of practice
- Master of Science in Physical Therapy preferred
- Valid licensure as Physical Therapist in Massachusetts required
- Experience in pediatric physical therapy required
- Bachelor's, Master's, or entry level Doctorate of Physical Therapy degree from an accredited college or university in the area of Physical Therapy is required
