- Responsible for project financial set up to allow tracking and control, regarding to the accounting requirements
- Work with the Project/Program Manager (PM), Control Account Managers (CAMs), and Lead Scheduler to update and maintain the Integrated Master Schedule (IMS), using Primavera P6, for the PCAPP project
- Maintain working level detailed schedules, using Primavera P6 or Microsoft Project, for high visibility items and special studies
- Work closely with the prime contractor and teaming subcontractors to ensure project schedule integration
- Support maintenance of the schedule baseline and incorporate schedule changes
- Participates in the bid and proposal process
- Ensure data quality and accuracy in the IMS, and address schedule anomalies as required

## Qualifications for project control analyst

- Coordinate budget and scope changes with the Cost Analyst
- Coordinate and conduct schedule review meetings with CAMs and Project Management
