Responsibilities for psychiatric

- Facilitates triage and care of acute cases and emergencies, referral of clients to other health care providers or inpatient service as indicated
- Documents all encounters with clients and maintains records in accordance with Department standards
- Attends team meetings to communicate with other professionals and with referral sources
- Interfaces with other professionals when clinically appropriate for patient care
- Seeks and provides clinical supervision when appropriate
- Attends meetings for collaboration with multidisciplinary team members
- Participates in Departmental and University meetings for continuing staff education
- Maintains current knowledge of mental health illness issues related to HIV/AIDS and substance abuse
- Provides feedback to supervisor on ongoing basis in regards to concerns, improvements, changes

Qualifications for psychiatric

Provides a comprehensive assessment of patient's psychosocial needs,

- Provides effective treatment to patients, whether assessment or therapy, and shares and interprets information to staff, families, and/or other approved agencies
- Completes written reports in a timely fashion as required
- Provides individual and psychotherapeutic services in accordance with current standards of practice, as developed by professional and licensing organizations, and defined and interpreted by supervisor
- Provides case management services for comprehensive evaluations
- Complies with unit practice standards relating to case management including addressing family and community resources, eligibility for entitlement programs, and other health care providers
