

Example of Registered Nurse Medical Job Description

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Our company is hiring for a registered nurse medical. We appreciate you taking the time to review the list of qualifications and to apply for the position. If you don't fill all of the qualifications, you may still be considered depending on your level of experience.

Responsibilities for registered nurse medical

- Implements care appropriate to diagnosis and per physician order
- Problem solves and coordinates clinic patient care with physician supervision
- Demonstrates competence in performing skills to include appropriate delivery of care according to the age-specific needs of the population served
- Assesses students upon admission and throughout their participation in our therapeutic milieu utilizing observational and interviewing skills
- Reviews overall student status every shift by reviewing physician orders, student treatment plan, and multi-disciplinary notes as applicable
- Helps to develop an individualized treatment plan in conjunction with student, family and treatment team members
- Works with the Director of Nursing and LPN's in auditing the student charts on a weekly basis to insure compliance with outside regulators
- Monitors and insures that all psychotropic medications are accounted for on a daily basis
- Facilitate health education townhouses/trainings on a variety of topics as needed
- Evaluates and documents the effectiveness of care and modifies nursing components of the patient's treatment plan accordingly

Qualifications for registered nurse medical

• As validated by RN II/III/IV formulates a plan of care for patients with

- interpretation of information obtained from the patient and others which ensures that direct and indirect nursing care provides for the patient's safety, comfort, hygiene and restorative measures
- Performs skills essential to the kind of nursing action to be taken, explains the health treatment to the patient and family and teaches the patient and family how to care for the client's health needs
- Delegates tasks to health team members based on their legal scope of practice and capabilities, follows up with health care team members and provides effective clinical guidance of patient care being given
- Evaluates the effectiveness of the plan of care through observation of the
 patient's physical condition and behavior, signs and symptoms of illness,
 reactions to treatment and through communication with the patient and
 health care team members and modifies the plan as needed
- Acts as the patient's advocate, as circumstances require, by working with
 resources to initiate the procedure to improve health care or to change
 decisions or activities which are against the interests or wishes of the patient
 and by giving the patient and family the opportunity to make informed
 decisions about health care before it is provided
- Participates in the development, implementation and evaluation of the orientation program for new personnel and the clinical education of nursing students and makes suggestions for specific changes to these programs
