Responsibilities for resident manager

- Coordinates resident activities
 - Inform ED of any health condition changes of IL residents
 - Schedules visits to IL residents temporarily confined to apartment
 - Conduct regularly scheduled resident meetings to again maintain a meaningful relationship with the residents and to serve their needs
 - Manage and coordinate all aspects of the human resources program with the Human Resources Department including hiring/firing, payroll, salary administration, unemployment, workers' compensation
 - Assist the Director of Nursing Services in planning, developing, organizing, implementing, evaluating, and directing the day-to-day functions of the Nursing Service department, in accordance with current rules, regulations, and guideline that govern the long-term facility
 - Participate in developing and maintaining, all ministry policies and procedures
 - Assist in developing methods for coordinating nursing services with other resident services to ensure the continuity of the Residents/patients total regimen of care
 - Make daily rounds of the Nursing Service Department to ensure that all nursing service personnel are performing their work assignments in accordance with acceptable nursing standards
 - Participate in the development of a written care plan (preliminary and comprehensive) for each resident that identifies the problems/needs of the resident, indicates that care to be given, goals to be accomplished, and which professional service is responsible for each element of care
