Responsibilities for resident pharmacist

- The Postgraduate year one (PGY1) pharmacy residency training is an organized, directed, program that builds upon knowledge, skills, attitudes, and abilities gained from an accredited professional pharmacy degree program
- The first-year residency program enhances general competencies in managing medication-use systems and supports optimal medication therapy outcomes for patients with a broad range of disease states age specific needs from pediatrics through geriatrics
- Be responsible for safe, effective, and timely medication use
- Perform all of the functions of health-systems based Pharmacist under the direct supervision of a Pharmacist, when not appropriately licensed
- Increase and improve depth of knowledge, skills, attitudes, and abilities to raise the level of expertise in medication therapy management and clinical leadership in the area of focus
- Function independently as a practitioner by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and transforming both into improved medication therapy for patients
- The resident will be committed to attaining the program's educational goals and objectives and will support the organization's mission and values
- The resident will take accountability to participate in all evaluations of preceptors or learners, and will provide thoughtful, constructive feedback to improve others abilities as both teachers and learners
- The resident will participate in further development of the program in which he or she is involved, always considering ways to improve the residency for

- The resident will participate in recruitment and on-boarding for current and incoming residents, assuring that the process knowledge gained is passed on to future learners

Qualifications for resident pharmacist

- California Board of Pharmacy Intern licensure required for employment until Pharmacist license is obtained
- Required to participate in the National Residency Matching Service
- Advanced Life Support (ACLS) for those who are primary code responders as defined by ministry / facility within 6 months of hire into position
- Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) for those who are primary code responders as defined by ministry / facility within 6 months of hire into position
- Requires current California Pharmacist license or pending licensure
- Requires the ability to communication in oral and written English
