Responsibilities for rn-infusion

- Initiates venipuncture according to physician's order
- Possesses knowledge of varied IV access routes and assesses patient to
- Caring for infected patients that have acute and chronic illnesses (i.e., viral, bacterial and fungal infections) while complying with proper infection control standards
- Providing wound care
- Infusion treatments for a patient base where $\frac{3}{4}$ are related to Infectious Disease
- Handling and administering medications on a regular basis, which are classified as hazardous materials, while following set policies/procedure for proper handling, administration, storage and disposal
- Have an extensive knowledge of chemotherapy administration and side effects, infusion therapy, pain management, knowledge and skills with port-a-caths and all venous access devices and excellent IV skills
- Conduct initial and ongoing patient assessment with attention to each patient's physical, emotional, psychosocial and spiritual needs
- Provide direction to team members to coordinate care of assigned patients and problem-solve patient care issues during the shift
- Health education / promotion

Qualifications for rn-infusion

- Minimum of 2 years nursing experience, preferably in an oncology environment

- Establishes access and maintains central line devices and peripheral intravenous access
- Demonstrates an understanding and practical approach to patient safety for care delivery for cancer patients
- Administers chemotherapy, blood products, IV medications, and biological agents in a safe manner
- Validates accurate chemotherapy doses
