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Our company is searching for experienced candidates for the position of rn-nights. If you don't fill all of the qualifications, you may still be considered depending on your level of experience.

Responsibilities for rn-nights

- Upon successful completion of a critical care course, RNs are expected to be knowledgeable about the physical, psycho social, spiritual, and rehabilitative aspects of the critically ill or potentially unstable patient and capable of applying appropriate therapeutic interventions
- Notifies family on condition changes Reports / assures timely follow up of signs / symptoms of resident infections
- On behalf of the Director of Nursing, provides for the continuity of nursing services in the development, implementation and evaluation of quality nursing care to residents and families
- Perform assessments on elder's that may have had a fall, a decline in condition or perhaps suicidal comments
- Act as the senior liaison and administrative person on the campus and address staffing and family concerns
- Asked to participate in auditing or QA activities
- Demonstrates the organization's commitment to sound ethical business practices as directed by the Corporate Compliance Office and approved by the Board of Trustees
- Demonstrate SPHP's Standards of Behavior and Core Values
- Contribute to a strong team environment and promote teamwork within the facility
- Provide care to assigned residents in a caring, safe and efficient manner and is responsible to perform the following according to location standards,

Qualifications for rn-nights

- Prefer expina Medical/Surgical Unit
- MUST have a current BLS/CPR Certification from the American Heart Association. No others will be accepted
- Must have demonstrated skills and ability to adjust schedule to meet patient and staff needs
- One year acute care nursing experience required
- TNCC required (with the exception of ED Connect designated RNs) within one year of hire
- ENPC (within 6 months)
