Responsibilities for RN wound care

- Researches new information related to specialty and communicates to staff
- Develops an interdisciplinary approach to client care with Agency staff
- Provides guidance to nursing staff and nursing students working on individual projects and research, including own clinical research activities
- Follows trends in specialty area and home care industry
- Assists in acquiring grants and special funding for expansion of clinical services
- Serves as a community liaison presenting informational programs to heighten awareness of needs of specialty population
