Responsibilities for scientific advisor

- Manage performance and development of scientific staff members for maximal success

- Developing assigned Franchise study protocols
- Supports the copy approval process for globally-derived materials (drives timely delivery through the process, working closely with the relevant content experts)
- Establishes strong working relationships and collaborates with key internal and external stakeholders to efficiently deliver training programmes and materials
- Gathers and shares best-practice across Global, Franchise and other LOCs to ensure high standards and excellence is maintained across the organization
- Fully understands and complies with local codes of practice, guidelines and laws to ensure the strictest requirements are met particularly with respect to delivery of promotional verses non-promotional information
- Lead abstract submission for Neuroscience National Conferences
- Authoring documents that include support for major regulatory agency submissions, clinical overviews, health hazard assessments, listings and summaries of the results of the above research to the required standard
