## Responsibilities for security systems technician

- Able to work overtime if necessary
- Provides technical oversight for electronic security system designs on capital improvement projects, ensuring designs and installations comply with institutional standards
- If required, recommends and manages outside service contracts
- Day-to-day management of all ACS, camera, systems, turnstile and other electronic systems
- Maintain trouble ticketing system for safety and security department
- Escalation of repair orders to third-party systems integrators or coordination of in-house entities for repairs IT, facilities, security
- Documentation and tracking of vendor contacts, vendor bidding processes
  (for new and repair processes), repair and service call scheduling, and
  ensuring security operations are aware of and able to manage vendor service
  and installs (communicate pass downs and instructions)
- Helping Security Operations Center (SOC) Operators and the badging officer(s) manage systems (computers, cameras/NVR and ACS)
- Ensures compliance with all access control policies
- Responsible for all access control system operation, including creating new badges, maintaining access groups structure, adding/removing access to restricted areas, system programming

## Qualifications for security systems technician
