Responsibilities for shipping operator

- Unlock and lock gates, office, lights
- Ensure forklift secured and stored in building
- Complete all required paperwork for carriers and return to shipping clerk
- Monitor inventories and turn over in timely manner
- Notify your supervisor immediately of any accident, near miss accident or onthe-job injury when it occurs no matter how insignificant it may seem
- Operate equipment only when you are trained in its use or are working with or under the direction of a qualified employee, and you are authorized to do so by your supervisor
- Wear proper personal protective equipment (PPE) at all times
- Finalizes paperwork to move and/or accompany receivables or shipments, , inland bills of lading, pack slips, hazardous declaration forms, completely and accurately to avoid penalties/fines
- Maintain work area in a neat, organized and clean manner at all times
- Transfer product from storage silos to the shipping silos

Qualifications for shipping operator

- Must be able to constantly bend, squat, reach, lift and push
- Ability to push/pull/lift/carry 10-50 lbs constantly, 51-100 lbs frequently, and
 75 lbs occasionally
- Must be able to perform a two person lift of boxes weighing up to 150

- Must be able to stand on feet for entire shift and walk periodically in narrow areas back and forth beside packing tables, shipping bundles, and trailers
- Must be able to climb onto and off of partially loaded truck trailers
- Must be able to climb and use stepladder in order to remove trailer bows and tarps and replace them
