- Explain nature, purpose and results of assessment in an understandable manner to IEP team members
- Assist teams in the development of IEPs that address physical and functional needs of students
- Develop a variety of evidence-based instructional activities to meet the student's individual occupational therapy goals/objectives
- Ensure student achievement and progress towards IEP goals and adjust intervention strategies based on student performance
- Monitor student progress and complete progress reports in accordance with KIPP Bay Area Schools and school-specific guidelines
- Performs all essential and marginal responsibilities of a Staff I Occupational Therapist
- Evaluates patients for occupational therapy treatment, including positioning, adaptive equipment, home programs, home accessibility, Independently provides and coordinates age-appropriate physical therapy treatment plans, treatment and consultation in typical patient care situations
- Utilizes thorough and appropriate evaluation techniques to establish realistic goals
- Collaborates with interdisciplinary team staff involved with patients' care to enhance the integration of services to maximize the patient's potential for recovery/improvement

- Exhibit a preference for working with people and a desire to help people regain physical functions
- Pennsylvania state licensure as an Occupational Therapist or eligible

- Bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy from an accredited school of Occupational Therapy, required
