Responsibilities for traffic management

- Provide the direction and leadership to a multi-disciplinary team in the delivery of traffic management schemes to major projects
- Organise and direct the marshalling of resources for the overall control and delivery of traffic management schemes
- Ensure that key dates, resource requirements, production rates, overhead targets , are established, monitored and controlled
