



Example of Wound Care Nurse Job Description

Responsibilities for wound care nurse

- Demonstrates competent utilization of interview, examination and observation techniques in obtaining patient history and wound history information
- Wound care expert
- Organize and implement wound care on inpatient and outpatient clinics
- Initiates and coordinates treatment plans for wound care patients
- The Case manager/Registered Nurse is accountable for the oversight of the clinical practice, outcomes and success of the Wound Care Center
- Coordinate and lead weekly wound team rounds and processes, including rounds, measurements, interdisciplinary care plan review, treatment recommendations, physician orders, and required documentation
- Educate newly hired nursing staff on Skin Practice Guide requirements and Skin Resource Library including wound assessments, preventive interventions, care planning, treatment selection options, documentation requirements and education resources available
- Evaluate availability of needed supplies for wound care and coordinate ordering with central supply
- Monitor changes in state and federal regulations and current industry-standard practices
- ACLS, PALS, NRP as defined by unit competencies (preferred)

Qualifications for wound care nurse

- Responsible for critical thinking and collaborative input on decisions
- Minimum 2 years experience in wound care
- American Heart Association (AHA) approved Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification required and must maintain thought employment
- Previous experience with a clinical Hyperbaric Program preferred
- Bachelor's in Nursing (BSN) Required, Master's degree highly preferred
