Responsibilities for wound care nurse

- The Wound Management Coordinator is responsible for the day to day coordination and oversight of all aspects of the Wound Management Program
- Keeps current with industry trends through ongoing specialized education in the area of skin and wound management
- Collaborates with an interdisciplinary team in the development and implementation of a comprehensive wound care program and in the care planning and treatment of individual veterans
- Supervision follows all accepted state and federal guidelines for the respective discipline
- Primary function- Performs weekly skin condition and wound rounds with members of the interdisciplinary team
- Is the designated first-line supervisory authority
- Is responsible for planning the work to be accomplished by subordinates, setting priorities and preparing schedules for completion of work
- Assigns work to subordinates based on priorities, selective consideration of the difficulty and the requirements of the assignments, and the capabilities of subordinates
- Makes recommendations for appointments, advancements or reassignments of subordinates
- Gives advice, counsel, or instruction to subordinate personnel on work and administrative matters

Qualifications for wound care nurse

- Minimum of 2 years nursing experience in the acute care setting preferred
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing required, Master's preferred
- Certified Wound Care Nurse (WOCN) preferred
- Previous committee leadership is preferred
- National Wound Certificatoin is preferred
